I am ready to get back to having worship, in the sanctuary, with all of you. I think we are all ready to do that. But given the directives of the governor and the prudent decisions of our Session, worship together (as well as all of our other church activities) will have to wait for a while. We are living in a time that requires patience. Patience is not easy but patience is one of the great Christian virtues. We see the importance of patience for the Christian in at

least two ways. First, we are all trying to become more like Jesus, to become better followers of HIM. Getting better at anything (like playing a musical instrument, playing a sport, learning a craft, or becoming a good friend or parent or spouse) takes time and effort. It requires patience to stick with it and get better. It requires faith that our efforts will eventually prove fruitful. God gives us patience as we keep working, and more importantly as HE keeps working in us, to become more like Jesus. We trust that HE who began that good work in us will bring it to completion (Philippians 1:6). Secondly, Christians are a people who are waiting for the return of Jesus Christ, for the coming of the Kingdom. We are looking forward to the day when God makes everything right again. That waiting also requires patience. In both of these examples, both in the work God is doing in us personally, and in the work HE is doing in the cosmos, we wait, and do our work, with confident assurance. God is using all things for HIS good and HIS purpose.

In Luke 21, Jesus is telling the disciples about some difficult times ahead. Jesus encourages them stay faithful in the difficult times. In the King James version, verse 19 of Luke 21 reads "In your patience possess ye your souls". This situation we are currently in will pass. But when we return to normal, we will still need to be patient. We will still need to persevere and be patient as we work to become more like Christ. We will still need to take care of others and forgive others and be patient with them. We will still need to trust God as HE works out HIS plan in the world, even as we do not understand all that HE does. The Good News of the Gospel is that God gives us the self-control to be patient, to prosper in the challenges of our lives. The Good News of the Gospel is that God gives us the power to be hopeful, joyful, and to be a blessing to others as we wait to see what HE is doing in us and through us. So, my friends, we will continue to be patient in these times: active in our work, trusting in God and ready to do and experience the next good thing HE has for us.

I hope everyone has a great May and Happy Mother's Day to all this month.


