Dear Prospect Presbyterian Church,

I believe that hope is an anchor for our souls and as we all have walked through a season of testing, I am reminded that my hope in Jesus will not put me to shame. Nevertheless, I come to you with an important and serious matter.

As we evaluated 2020, we saw a 45% increase in referrals in the Charlotte-Metro area. There are numerous factors to this and yet one constant remains: *we are positioned to support a young, traumatized girl that is desperate for hope*. Based on what January and February have presented, we are trending towards receiving 75 new referrals in 2021. Considering the 21 that we carried from 2020, I would estimate that we are looking to serve around 95+ girls in 2021. This will be 56% increase from pre-covid time.

With each passing week, I am reminded just how needed our work is, but also how massive the problem really is. We are in a desperate predicament to manage the demand for services and as a result **WE MUST HIRE AN ADDITIONAL CASE MANAGER.** We were planning and preparing for this in 2022, but we must accelerate the timeline. The alternative will be to turn girls away and we are nearing that point. Now, more than ever, I need the church to stand with us.

I invite you to join us by giving a one-time gift, above and beyond your committed amount. We are looking to our church partners to help us secure \$40,000 to move forward with hiring an additional case manager position. We are looking to secure funding <u>by April 30 <sup>th</sup></u>. Perhaps you have a surplus that you could give from or you would consider taking up a special love offering for Present Age. With over 40 church partners, if each one contributed, the need would easily be met.

Please partner with us in praying for this need to be met. We know God is faithful. As I wrap up this letter, I can hear hope echoing throughout our office. Today, girls are here for tutoring and the sound of laughter and healing is evident. My heart rejoices with each of these moments and that is why we need you! The church is the answer to this crisis, and I am grateful for your support as we navigate this season.
