



Session News

Your Session had its regular stated meeting on April 21st at 7pm, moderated by Rev. Will Gipe.

Treasurer reported balances on 4/19: General Fund balance - \$98,855 Family Life Center balance - \$16,936 Elevator Fund balance - \$531,016

- Denied a request from the owners of McCann's Place to use our parking lot for their food truck and use of our kitchen facilities until they can find a new permanent location as this would be too much of a liability for us.
- * Approved spending \$3,241.69 to install a new removeable "mullion" on the 8ft tall exit doors on the Family Life Center. Due to their size these doors do not lock consistently even after they have been repeatedly adjusted. This "mullion" will ensure the doors lock each time and it can be easily removed if both doors need to open to move a large item through. True Craft Builders (FLC contractor) will perform installation.
- * Approved inquiry with Christian Tours about purchasing one of their used small buses that does not require a CDL.

Continued with Facilities Review Committee Recommendations:

- * Approved spending up to \$10,000 from the General Fund for security measures to the nursery wing of the Education Building in support of Children's Church. True Craft Builders provided quote of \$7,470.46 which includes:
- Remove left hand door and install right hand door /jamb with tempered glass sidelight and exit device to prevent unauthorized access.
- * Replace current locks with new exit devices on both exterior doors at Children's Music Room prevent unauthorized access.
- * Paint jamb and door panel
- * Approved to begin "spring cleaning" of all buildings. In the next month or so the committee chairs will be organizing a review of room by room, keeping what is useful and important, offering remaining items to members or donating to others. Any remaining items will be discarded as trash.


