Have a good September my friends. Know that you are loved.






HEALTH NEWS!

Your Session had its regular stated meeting on August 18th at 7pm, moderated by Rev. Will Gipe.

Treasurer reported balances on 8/15/2022:

General Fund balance - \$92,855
Family Life Center balance - \$16,180
Elevator Fund balance - \$631,996



- Church van sold for \$10,000 with money held in a 6 month CD until Session determines path forward on another vehicle.
- Church notified of a forthcoming \$50,000 gift from the estate of Allen Lowrance to establish a scholarship fund in memory of his parents and brother. More details to follow.
- Approved Congregational Meetings: September 11th- for election of three (3) active members of the congregation to join Elders Brian Jackson and Connie Brown as the 2022 Nominating Committee and October 30th -for election of Elders to the Class of 2025
- Approved \$300/mth thru December 2022 for Rev. Gipe for mileage due to increased gasoline costs.
- Approved soliciting interest/donations in upgrading the organ chambers (rooms on each side of sanctuary) to improve organ sound in the sanctuary. Pat McCall solicited input from the Allen Organ Company, our organ manufacturer, and they recommended this change. Estimated cost \$15,418.
- Approved creation of an Elevator Research Committee to investigate type and location of an elevator for current and future use along with annual maintenance costs. Current members are: Paul Moore, Rick Lyerly, and Walter Teeter. Additional members to be named at next meeting along with a specific charter.
