Each box packed full of quality toys, school supplies, and personal care items becomes a tangible expression of God's immense love for the child. For many, it is their first gift ever!"

The Mission Committee wants to encourage every family to pack at least one shoebox this year. You can pick up the shoeboxes and labels here at church. Pack your box, and drop it off at church by **Sunday**, **November 13**.

What to include in your box: Start with a quality "wow" item such as a stuffed animal, soccer ball with pump, or clothing outfit that will capture the child's attention the instant he or she opens the box. Do not include: Candy; toothpaste; gum; used or damaged items; scary or war-related items; chocolate or food; seeds; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items; aerosol cans.

OCC asks for a \$10 processing fee per box. We don't want that to be a deterrent, so the church will send \$10 to OCC for up to 100 boxes. That way, if you don't pay your processing fee, the church has you covered.




#### **SESSION NEWS**


