# September 21 World Alzheimer's Day

World Alzheimer's Day, September 21st of each year, is a day on which Alzheimer's organizations around the world concentrate their efforts on raising awareness about Alzheimer's and dementia. Alzheimer's disease is the most common form of dementia, a group of disorders that impairs mental functioning.

Every 65 seconds, someone develops Alzheimer's disease. At current rates, experts believe the number of Americans living with Alzheimer's will quadruple to as many as 16 million by the year 2050. Alzheimer's disease is often called a family disease because of the chronic stress of watching a loved one slowly decline affects everyone. 5.7 million Americans are living with Alzheimer's. Alzheimer's disease is the sixth-leading cause of death in the United States and the only cause of death among the top 10 in the United States that cannot be prevented, cured or even slowed. Treasurer reported balances on 8/15: General Fund balance - \$142,238 Development Fund Balance - \$69,722



Approved to reinstate Bobby and Linda Fesperman to the active roll.

Approved to contract with Ed Brooks Tree Service for \$23,000 to remove 7 large trees near the Session House and adjacent to cemetery to prevent further damage. Additionally trim numerous trees on church property by removing dead or dying limbs some caused by recent storm damage.

Received report from the Elevator Research Committee and unanimously approved the following pending Congregational Approval:

Approve to build elevator tower at rear of church and install a 3500 lb capacity elevator that will access all 3 floors at an estimated cost of \$907,348.94 based on current information.

Set up a Financial Team consisting of the Elevator Building Committee, Trustees, and the Finance Committee to determine best funding options prior to Congregational Meeting.

Approve the Elevator Research Committee to become the Elevator Building Committee and complete the elevator scope/design/build effort.

Additional information will be presented later at the next Congregational Meeting.
