Your Session had its regular stated meeting on August 21, 2025 at 7:00 p.m., moderated by Rev. Will Gipe.

Account balances as of August 20, 2025 were reported as follows:

- General Fund Balance - \$196,109
- Development Fund Balance – \$36,403
- General Fund Reserve Balance - \$69,773



- ◆ Received a report that the Church received a gift of \$100,000.00 designated for the general fund reserve. The funds have been placed in treasuries with Raymand James.
- ◆ Received a report that a new circle, “Circle of Sisters” has been started.
- ◆ Received a report that our new Choir Director, Kelly Hutcheson, has been hired and that her start date will be around September 1, 2025.
- ◆ Received a report that extensive cleaning has been done in Education Building.
- ◆ Discussed future capital expenditures of the Church, specifically the replacement of the A/C unit and boiler for the Sanctuary Building, and being financially prepared for the same when it becomes necessary.
- ◆ Approved replacing the flooring in the basement of the Sanctuary Building and repaving and striping the parking lot at a total cost not to exceed \$100,000.00.
- ◆ Received a report from the Cemetery Committee that headstone repair had been mostly completed. The same company will also clean headstones and footstones. Families can request and pay to have cleanings done at a cost of \$250 for a double headstone, \$150 for a single headstone and \$50 for a footstone.
- ◆ Received a report that a new adult Sunday School Class will be started.
- ◆ Received a report that the Boy Scouts have moved out of the Church, but left a flag for the Church to be placed in the Heritage Room.
- ◆ The next Feed the Hunger event will be on October 26, 2025.
- ◆ Received a report that a blood drive was held on August 21, 2025 and went very well.
- ◆ The next Lunch and Learn will be October 19, 2025 and will be “Ask the Experts.”
- ◆ Homecoming will be September 21, 2025 and Scott Wilkinson will be the speaker.
- ◆ Received a report regarding the various age ranges of the congregation.


